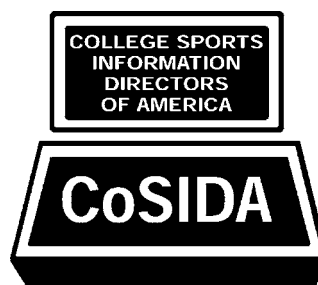

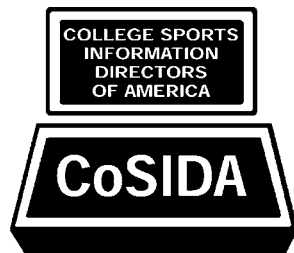

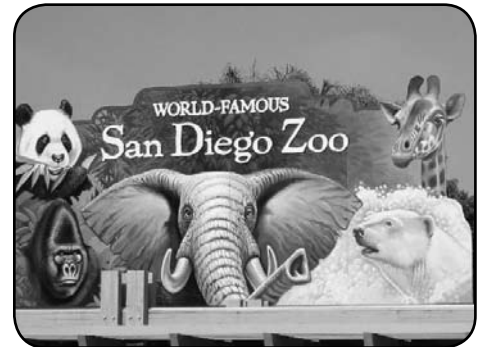
- Gorgeous weather (same perfect temp all year long)***

Borghetti Now Associate A.D.

E.J. Borghetti has been promoted to the position of associate athletic director for media relations, University of Pittsburgh athletic director Jeff Long announced.

"E.J. is such a valuable asset to not only the University of Pittsburgh, but the entire Pittsburgh community and we are pleased to be able to reward him in this way," Long said. "His expertise in the field of media relations, as well as Pitt athletics as a whole, makes him an invaluable part of our athletic department."

Borghetti is in his 10th year serving in Pitt's media relations office. In his position as associate athletic director for media relations, Borghetti will serve as a spokesperson and primary contact to the media for Pitt Athletics, serve as counselor, advisor and strategic collaborator to the Director of Athletics, coaches and senior administrators and will oversee the development and serve as contributing editor of Pitt Athletics print and web publications.

Borghetti currently oversees the daily publicity efforts for the Panthers' 19 intercollegiate sports. Among other administrative responsibilities, he handles the media relations efforts for Pitt's football team. In this capacity he has enjoyed the privilege of promoting three first team All-Americans, two Biletnikoff Award winners, a Walter Camp Award winner and a Heisman Trophy runner-up.

Borghetti's writing was recently recognized by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). His profile of Pitt football coach Dave Wannstedt received a "Second in the Nation" citation in CoSIDA's national writing contest. Recently, linebacker H.B. Blades was named a first team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and Sports Illustrated.

In 2003, Borghetti handled the publicity for receiver Larry Fitzgerald, a unanimous All-American who was the first-ever sophomore to be selected the Walter Camp Player of the Year. Fitzgerald additionally won the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's top receiver and was the Heisman Trophy runner-up.

Borghetti also promoted consensus All-America receiver Antonio Bryant, who was the Biletnikoff winner in 2000. Pitt is the only school to have multiple winners of the Biletnikoff Award.

In addition to his media relations duties, Borghetti helps spread the word on the Panthers in other capacities. He regularly serves as emcee for Panther Club func-

tions and additionally contributes feature writing to the athletic department publication Panther Eyes.

Borghetti has extensive ties to the University of Pittsburgh. He is a 1992 magna cum laude graduate from the school with a bachelor's degree in communications and was as an undergraduate sports information intern. His father, Ernie, was an All-America tackle for the Panthers in 1963 and helped them to a 9-1 record and No. 3 national ranking that year.

Outside of Pitt, Borghetti serves on the American Diabetes Association Leadership Council and on the board for the HOPE Network, an organization that promotes community integration of individuals with cognitive and/or physical challenges in Southwestern Pennsylvania.

A native of New Castle, Pa., Borghetti married the former Lauren Pirilla, a 1998 Pitt graduate, this past June. The couple resides in Gibsonia.

Penn State Altoona Crider Named SID

Tipton, Penn., native Steven Crider was named as Sports Information Director (SID) at Penn State Altoona. At just 21 years of age, he becomes one of the youngest full time sports information directors at any college or university in the country.

We are very excited to add Steve to our athletics staff, said Penn State Altoona athletic director Fredina Ingold. We have enjoyed watching him grow from an undergraduate intern to a full-time staff member over the last year. He brings great enthusiasm and excitement to the position, and with his hiring, we can now expand the coverage and public exposure of Lion athletics.

The 2003 Bellwood Antis High School graduate continued his education at California University of Pennsylvania, where he graduated with a Communication degree in just three years. The final year was not spent on the California campus, as he returned home to complete a two-semester internship with Penn State Altoona's athletic department. He finished his education this past August, interviewed for the SID position in October, and days later was hired effective December 18.

Im flattered and very grateful to Chancellor Bechtel, Fredina Ingold, Brent Baird, and all the wonderful people at Penn State Altoona for this opportunity, noted Crider. Working with the staff over the past 13 months has reaffirmed my commitment to Penn State Altoona, the athletics department, and this line of work. This is certainly a gigantic first step in my career.

Crider will serve as the primary media contact for the athletics department. His other responsibilities will include writing press releases, creating athletic publications, maintaining the athletics website, marketing and promoting teams and athletes, overseeing statistics and in-game management, and working closely with the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference and NCAA. During his internship and part-time employment, Crider assumed most of the sports information responsibilities from his boss and mentor, Brent Baird.

It will certainly be a welcome challenge, Crider said, referring to the day to day tasks of an SID.

But Ive been doing the job for the past year and my familiarity with the policies and procedures at Penn State Altoona makes the transition to full-time work much easier.

At Bellwood-Antis High School, Crider played varsity basketball for four years and junior varsity and varsity baseball for three. During his senior year, he played an integral role in the schools third-ever District VI boys basketball championship and was named an Altoona Mirror third-team all star. At California (PA), he was heavily involved in the schools radio and TV broadcasting program, doing play-by-play for Vulcan sports teams and anchoring the sports segment of California University TVs NewsCenter program. He completed an internship with Kellie Goodman at WTAJ-TV 10 Sports in summer 2004.

Much of the credit goes to my family, friends, teachers, colleagues, and everyone else who has helped prepare me for a professional career, said Crider. Without those influences, I would not be in the position I am today.

Crider resides in Tipton with his parents and sister Haley, who is a freshman at Penn State Altoona and starts on the schools volleyball team.



Master of Details, McAlexander Dies

The phrase "attention to detail" wasn't invented by Walt McAlexander, but no one took it to heart more than he did.

Alexander, a longtime Avalanche-Journal sports writer and later **sports information director at both Lubbock Christian University and Texas Tech**, died Wednesday after a long battle with Alzheimer's Disease. He was 62.

As an A-J sports writer from 1964-76, McAlexander earned a reputation as a stickler for details and as someone who loved to compile and maintain statistics. Those qualities came in handy when he served as a sports information director at then-Lubbock Christian College and Texas Tech, where he earned numerous awards both as a writer and an SID.

"He was just a great friend," said Tech baseball coach Larry Hays, who worked with McAlexander at both schools. "He was someone who really cared for other people, and I don't think I ever heard him be unkind to anyone at any time. I always enjoyed my association with him and especially working together."

McAlexander was the primary publicist for two national championship teams - LCU's NAIA World Series champion in 1983 and the Lady Raiders' NCAA Tournament winner in 1993. He assembled media guides with exhaustive information on LCU teams comparable to those put together by major-college programs.

The LCU athletic department, in a statement released Wednesday, commended his promotional work.

"Had it not been for Walt's efforts," it read in part, "not only would the exploits of Lubbock Christian not have been made known, but more importantly, countless lives would have never benefited from McAlexander's gentlemanly attitude, his tireless commitment to family, community and church, and his genuine love of sports."

McAlexander, who was born in Mt.

Vernon, Ill., graduated from Plainview High School, South Plains College and Sam Houston State before going to work for the A-J. Covering multiple sports, but particularly baseball, his love of statistics and record-keeping really began to take shape.



While at the A-J he won national writing awards from the American Association of College Baseball Coaches in 1972 and 1973, was nominated for Texas Sports Writer of the Year in 1970 and was named Texas Bowling Writer of the Year in 1977.

"His strength was he was a detail guy," said A-J editor emeritus Burle Pettit, the sports editor who hired McAlexander in the mid 1960s. "Back in the days when you had to figure your own boxscores and standings, everybody just hitched their chairs to Walt and he figured them out for them. He was very personable and such a detail guy that you never worried about his accuracy."

He worked for Lubbock Christian from 1970-91 as sports information director and assistant athletic director, overlapping his duties with the A-J for the first several years. Providing statistics for both basketball and a fledgling baseball program in the early 1970s, McAlexander's encyclopedic knowledge for facts and figures continued to serve him well.

"He was working with the paper...

and our first game he totaled our box and all that," Hays said. "He asked me if I'd like him to start doing that for the next game and I said sure. He was there from day one and that's why Lubbock Christian stats were something to behold. If you played at Lubbock Christian you better not fudge on your stats because Walt had them in the book.

McAlexander also displayed a knack for detailed and outstanding writing as an SID. His LCU media guides received 24 national awards, including two National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics-Sports Information Directors Association (NAIA-SIDA) All-Sports competition awards.

He conducted the preseason NAIA baseball poll for 12 years and was honored in 1988 with the Clarence "Ike" Pearson Award given to the NAIA sports information director of the year. He also served a lengthy term as the NAIA District VIII information director and as president of the NAIA-SIDA from 1985-86. He also received three NAIA Awards of Merit.

In 1990, he was inducted into the NAIA Baseball Hall of Fame for meritorious service, and later that year served as the publicist for the United States Baseball Federation's Junior Olympic Baseball Super Series.

McAlexander left LCU in the early 1990s to join the sports information staff at Texas Tech, where he served as the main media contact during the women's basketball team's national-title run. He also served as the main contact for Red Raider volleyball and baseball, rejoining with Hays, before leaving in 1997.

The NAIA-SIDA in 2006 passed a resolution renaming the annual NAIA baseball brochure contest in McAlexander's honor, a resolution that could be passed as early as this summer.

CoSIDA Hall of Famer Pete Nevins Passes Away

EAST STROUDSBURG, PA - Long-time East Stroudsburg University Sports Information Director Pete Nevins died at Lehigh Valley Hospice in Allentown. He was 68.

He was the beloved husband of Gail Nevins with whom he celebrated 45 years of marriage on Dec. 23rd.

Nevins spent 33 years as ESUs Sports Information Director before his retirement and then wrote a column for The Pocono Record in East Stroudsburg. He arrived in the Poconos in 1969 and handled public relations, promotions, special events during his tenure at ESU. He wrote articles on more than 12,000 ESU athletic events that involved more than 5,000 student-athletes.

Nevins was a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Hall of Fame and received the Warren Berg Award as the nation's outstanding college division SID. He served two terms on the CoSIDA Board of Directors, 1974-75 and 1978-80.

He also won the ECAC-SIDA's top honor, the Irving T. Marsh Award. This past summer, he was presented with the Bob Kenworthy Good Person Award at the annual ECAC-SIDA Convention. The award is presented to an exceptional person who through their actions shows the same respect for the profession, their fellow SID's, the media and community as Bob Kenworthy did during his long and successful career.

Nevins served as president of the ECAC-SIDA in 1976-77 and was a member of the NCAA Public Relations Committee for seven years. He also was president of the Connecticut Sports Writers Alliance in 1967-68. He was honored with a CoSIDA first place national writing award in 2000. He also won more than 30 national publications awards.

Nevins taught a graduate course in Public Relations in Sport Management at ESU. He wrote the sports section for the book, "Pride and Promise, a

Centennial History of East Stroudsburg University."

Nevins helped start the Lehigh Valley Small College Basketball Luncheons and was instrumental in developing the careers of SIDs all over the country. He served on panels at conferences and was a backup radio announcer for Warriors football. He volunteered his time



to keep statistics at ESU football and basketball games and was a frequent contributor to the university's Alumni Herald. His College Corner column ran each week in the Pocono Record and detailed the collegiate accomplishments of Monroe County student-athletes. He was a member of the Society of Professional Journalists, the Basketball Writers of America and the Football Writers of America. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army Reserves.

The New York City native received a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from the University of Miami in 1960 and a master's degree in Health and Physical Education from East Stroudsburg in 1984.

Nevins spent seven and a half years as a sportswriter at the Bridgeport, Ct. Post-Telegram. He also served as the

sports information director at the University of Bridgeport from 1963-69.

Nevins was on the board of the Friends of the Eastern Monroe Public Library and also the library's Foundation board; and was a volunteer facilitator at The Older Adult Learning Center in East Stroudsburg. He previously was involved in coaching Minor League in Stroudsburg and president of the Clearview School PTO.

He is also survived by two sons: Douglas Nevins and his wife, Jenifer (Lewis) Nevins, of West Chester; Daniel Nevins and his wife, Lisa (Swart) Nevins, of Wayne; grandchildren Sean, Henlee and Kendall of West Chester, Luke of Wayne, and Natalie and Phoebe of Wayne and Dublin, Ireland; his brother, Bert Nevins, Jr. and his wife, Frances, of Plantation, FL; his sister Peggy Windsor and her husband, Raymond, of Plantation, FL; and three nephews, Scott Windsor and Aaron and Nathan Nevins.

SPRING SPORTS ARE UPON US

NCAA STATISTICS

While spring sports are upon us, we are still going strong with winter sports, and the NCAA the statistics department would like to thank you for a great year so far. We would also like to clarify a few items that have generated some questions here lately

ROSTERS

Please make sure that you have entered your spring rosters for baseball, softball and men's and women's lacrosse. The rosters can be updated throughout the particular season. You can add or delete players as the season progresses, but anyone who has any stats recorded during the season cannot be deleted. By entering your rosters now, you save your conference sports information director headaches when he or she begins the weekly reporting. You will also save yourself trouble when it is time for you to enter your final statistics. Please don't send your conference SID box scores that have players listed with just a uniform number and no name, or generate your season-to-date files that you send in to the conference SID with these incomplete box scores. These will appear in your stats here, and since they're listed with a game played – will remain on your stats.

When you are entering your roster for each individual sport, the NCAA Staff has a few pointers for you. Please enter the eligibility year for each individual student-athlete, not their class in school. Also, when a player is no longer on the team, you need to DELETE each player and number instead of just typing over the past individual.

We have had a number of incidents where a new name was combined with a former player's id number and the new athlete was credited with the former player's statistics. So to make sure this does not happen, we ask that you DELETE the old player and add the new player.

MEN'S/WOMEN'S SOCCER RECORDS BOOK UPDATES

With the recent conclusion of the men's and women's soccer seasons, it is now time for the annual check of soccer records. In your records check, you need not confine it to the past season. Perhaps you have undertaken additional research since the last edition and found a performance prior to 2006 that belongs in the publication. Please remember, however, that your school must have been an active member of that division to be included in the records book. Any corrections and updates you have for any portion of the records book may be submitted to us.

We will begin updating the records book at the end of January, so please forward anything to us by ASAP. Any changes for the men's portion of the book should be sent to Jeff Williams, while changes for the women should be sent to Bonnie Senappe. You can mail those to us at the NCAA, P.O. Box 6222, Indianapolis, IN 46206-6222. If you prefer, you can email them to us at jswilliams@ncaa.org and bsenappe@ncaa.org, or by fax at 317-917-6800. We prefer email or regular mail.

In the past, we sent you photocopies of the records book, but now we prefer it if you simply just send us pages that have changes. You can photocopy the pages from the records book, or you just simply note the information in full detail and send it to us. For example:

Page 14: Most assists by a player in a game. Mary Swanson (7), Notre Dame vs. Illinois, Sept. 25, 2004.

Page 27: Most goals scored by a team in a game. Santa Clara (25), Oct. 28, 2004 vs. Texas Tech.

Please make sure you check all of the sections of the book, including all-time won-loss records, coaching records, etc. Thank you for your cooperation and let us know if you have any questions.

FOOTBALL RECORDS BOOK UPDATES

With the football season completed, it is time for you to submit any individual or team records – game, season or career – your players or team set during the 2004 campaign. Please email all DII and DIII men's records to Sean Straziscar at sstrazicar@ncaa.org. For Division I and I-AA, please forward information to J.D. Hamilton at jhamilton@ncaa.org. Deadline for submitting records is ASAP.

VOLLEYBALL RECORDS BOOK UPDATES, TOO

If anyone has not sent in their updates for the volleyball records book, please send those in, listing complete information needed for each category, to jblomenberg@ncaa.org. Check out your career leaders and see if they fit into any of the categories, as well. If you have any questions, contact Jenn Blomenberg at 317-917-6142 or via email. Deadline for any changes is Feb. 14, 2005.

BASEBALL/SOFTBALL ATTENDANCE

Friendly reminder about your attendance totals when your team plays in a doubleheader. When your institution plays in a baseball or softball doubleheader, leave the attendance total for one of the box scores blank and put the attendance figure for the doubleheader on the other.

The NCAA counts attendance for dates, not games in baseball and softball. If you are playing in a tournament and have separate attendance figures for each game, i.e., the stadium is cleared and then fans are reseated, then you should list an attendance figure for each game. When you list 50 and 50 for two games of the dh, it shows up as playing on two dates, instead of one.

BASEBALL/SOFTBALL HELPFUL HINTS

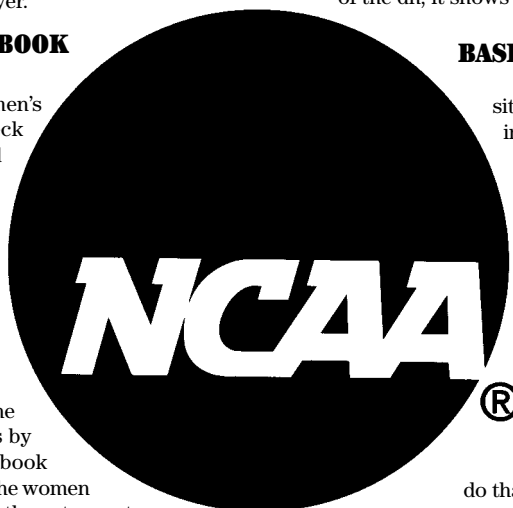
Baseball and softball have a couple of unique situations that we want everyone to understand going into early season tournaments.

Sometimes the home team may need to be the visiting team (in order to bat first) in the Statcrew software. While in the "Game Info" menu, simply put in an 'H' in the neutral site box. Statcrew will then recognize this as a "home" game for the team batting first. This is very important for home win-loss records and for attendance at the end of the season.

In softball, your team may use the international tiebreaker rule and you will be required to place a runner at second base before the extra inning begins. The FAQ section on www.statcrew.com is very helpful if you have a question about how to do that. It says:

To place a runner on 2nd base to start the extra inning(s), enter R:#,b where # represents the spot in the lineup of the runner to be placed on base (not the defensive position or uniform number), and b represents the base number. For example, R:7,2 would place the person batting seventh in the batting order on second base. Then continue scoring the inning as usual.

Regarding the scoring for the international tiebreaker, if this runner scores, the run is automatically scored as team unearned by TAS, so the run does not affect the pitcher's earned run average. There are no other ramifications to this pitcher's ERA by scoring the play this way, so we suggest letting the software handle it (taking the pitcher out of the game for that runner will affect complete game stats, etc.).



SCORE REPORTING

The NCAA statistics staff would like to be clear on the issue of score reporting and sending in weekly statistics. The reporting of statistics and score reporting process are two entirely different procedures handled by the statistics group and the championships staff, respectively.

Statistics reporting procedures are still the same as they have been for a number of years. If you do not receive instructions from any of the statistics staff (which includes Jim Wright, Gary Johnson, Sean Straziscar, Bonnie Senappe, J.D. Hamilton, Jenn Blomenberg, Jeff Williams and statistics assistant Kevin Buerge), then you should continue with regular statistics reporting procedures.

Questions . . .

With Tim Glon
Sports Information Director
Ohio Northern University

1. Talk about your career path. What advice you have for recent college grads who want to work in the sports information profession?

I've been at three different levels during my career. I worked for three years as an undergrad at Purdue under Jim Vrugink, then for two years at Marshall under Gary Richter while I earned my Master's degree. I have been at Ohio Northern for 16 years, the past 13 as SID. I also was an assistant women's basketball and softball coach at ONU for one year and worked as a sportswriter for three years between my SID job at Marshall and ONU. Many, many people have influenced me personally and professionally and it would be a long list to thank them all. My advice for incoming students is to be as involved as possible with the SID office, the campus newspaper and/or the athletics administration people as an undergrad. It's amazing what you can learn just from being there.

2. Why have you stayed in Division III?

I had no timetable for staying at Ohio Northern when I got here, but I really enjoy the small college level. ONU is a wonderful place to be. Our athletes are great kids, we have an athletic department made up of very good people and the administration is very supportive. I have been at the Big 10 and the I-AA levels and there are some very good things about those levels, too. But I just enjoy being at Division III. The level of play in the Ohio Athletic Conference is outstanding. This is not glorified high school. These kids can play, so the games themselves are still very entertaining.

3. The pressure on sports information professionals to work longer hours continues to grow. How do you ensure that your life retains some balance?

Just say no sometimes. There's always more that can be done, so there are times when we just say "time's up - go home." My assistant, Gary Petit, and I work enough. We don't both have to be at every game or event. We make an extra effort to get time off, which includes some weekends. We also have talented students that we put a great deal of responsibility on. These kids are paying to go to school and learn, so we let them learn. Our students write most of the game stories, prepare most of the game programs and do a great deal of in-game work. There is no way we would succeed without their help.

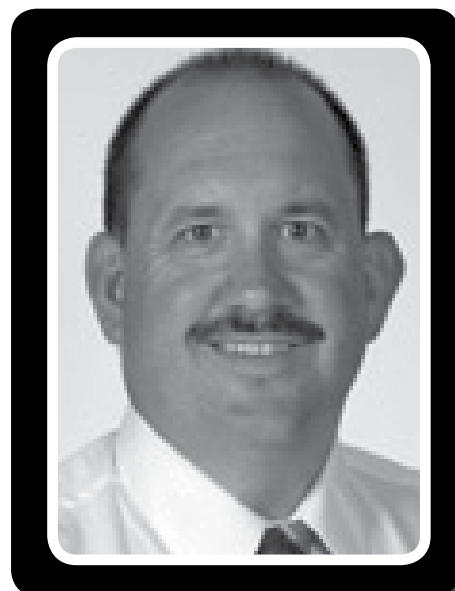
4. In prioritizing your work, are there tasks or projects you

have deemed no longer necessary?

That's a great question. I think there comes a point where you reach overkill and that is a different point each day and for each sport. We try to then have students do things or come up with other solutions. For example, we noticed a few years ago that we had pretty much stopped doing feature stories. At the time, we didn't have students who could do it, so we invented "Chillin' with a Polar Bear," where we ask a student/athlete 10 questions about his or her sport, career and personal life at ONU. It's not nearly as difficult as writing a feature and we can easily assign it to a student. We've been doing it for 6-7 years now and it's still a big hit.

5. What's the secret to getting the most productivity from your student workers?

Make it fun and let the students do what you ask them to do. Delegating a task and then getting out of the way was the most difficult challenge I faced as a head SID. I was used to doing everything myself. Teach the students the task and then let them do it. Be available for questions, but stay out of the way. Our students are very essential to the success of the office. Once they have learned that, and they are in a fun atmosphere, their productivity goes way up. Working in the SID office is not the most important thing in these student's lives, so making it fun and rewarding is very important.

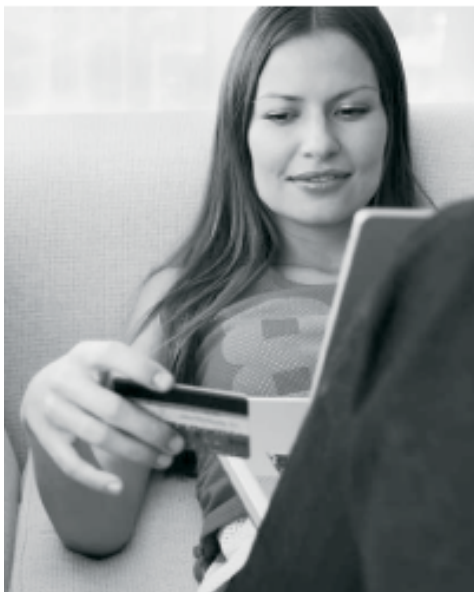
