Elite 89 Award – Since some SIDs are responsible for filling out the forms the information follows. The Elite 89 award is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average competing at the finals site for each of the NCAA's 89 championships. Each institution that has at least one student-athlete qualify for the finals round/site is eligible to nominate a student-athlete to win the award for that championship. FTP Site - The NCAA has developed a website to retain key information from every Division I, Division II and Division III conference and institution which may participate in an NCAA Championship. The NCAA and partners (i.e. Turner/CBS, ESPN, IMG College, Big Screen Network Productions, etc.) are required to use the site to access all logos, fight songs, rosters, photos of student-athletes, teams, coaches, administrators and campus for use on selection shows, game programs, banquet videos and video boards at NCAA championships. For this site to be completely effective, it requires full cooperation from participating institutions. Please log on to www.ncaachampionship.info (username: ncaaschools; password: ncaafpt) to upload the appropriate information for your institution or conference. In addition, if you have a videoboard and would like this information for an opponent please let us know so we can give you the download password. THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION IS OCTOBER 19.

For the following sports in every division, please upload a roster and team photo – also for NCAA.com selection shows we need action photos of three to five student-athletes and (if applicable) three to five minutes of video in either 720p quicktime files or H.264 files:

Men's and women's cross country (no video needed), Field Hockey, Football, Men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball and men's water polo.

For the following DIVISION I SPORTS ONLY, please upload a roster, team photo, institutional PSA, action photos of three to five players as well as head shots of your president, athletics director, senior woman administrator and head coach:

FCS Football, Men's and Women's Soccer and Volleyball.

In addition, we are asking each institution to upload an athletics logo (eps format) and your school fight song (mp3 format) into the appropriate folders if you haven't already done so. These were the only two things moved over from last year to avoid any confusion.

The process of uploading your materials is quite simple. Once you log in to the site, select the "institutions" folder to locate your school (the search tool is the easiest way to find a school). After selecting your school folder, you will see individual folders for the materials we are requesting. Please make sure to enter the information into the correct sport folder. To add content, click on the desired folder and then select "upload files" on the top toolbar, and repeat as necessary.
