TOWSON, Md. – Wrestler **Luke McPeek** of Adams State College and senior swimmer **Catherine Leix** of Wayne State headline the 2012 Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's and Women's At-Large Teams as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

The Capital One Division II Academic All-America® program is being financially supported by the NCAA Division II national governance structure to assist CoSIDA with handling the awards fulfillment aspects for the 2011-12 Division II Academic All-America® teams program.

The Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large program includes the sports of fencing, golf, gymnastics, ice hockey, lacrosse, rifle, skiing, swimming and diving, tennis, water polo and wrestling.

The Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Women's At-Large program includes the sports of bowling, crew, fencing, field hockey, golf, gymnastics, ice hockey, lacrosse, rifle, skiing, swimming and diving, tennis and water polo.

McPeek, a graduate student with a degree in counseling and a 3.91 G.P.A., has been named as the Capital One Academic All-America® of the Year for the Division II Men's At-Large Program.

Leix, a Science Education major with a 3.96 G.P.A., has been named as the Capital One Academic All-America® of the Year for the Division II Women's At-Large Program.

One of four wrestlers who were named to the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large first team, McPeek is a U.S. Marine who enjoyed an outstanding two-year career at Adams State. He capped off his career by winning the NCAA Division II national championship at 197-pounds. A native of Albuquerque, New Mexico, McPeek won his national title with a 14-12 overtime decision over previously unbeaten Daniel Scanlan of Limestone. Named as the Outstanding Wrestler of the Meet, he finished the season with a 22-4 record with eight falls.

Honored as the 2012 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Academic Wrestler of the Year, McPeek posted a 49-13 record in two years competing for the Grizzlies. A U.S. Marine, McPeek capped an outstanding career at the NCAA Division II National Championships, winning the title at 197 lbs. with a 14-12 overtime decision over previously undefeated **Daniel Scanlan** of Limestone. He was named the Outstanding Wrestler of the Tournament and finished the year with a 22-4 record, with eight falls.

McPeek concluded his two-year career at Adams State with a 49-13 record and earned All-American honors twice. He finished sixth at 197-pounds at the NCAA Championship Meet in 2011.

A repeat selection on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Women's At-Large first team, Leix led Wayne State to its first NCAA Division II national championship in swimming and diving. She was also named as the Detroit Athletic Club Michigan College Female Athlete of the Year. Leix swam the second leg of the 2012 national champion 800-frees relay which set a school record. In addition, she was a first team All-America in the 500-free, 1000-free and 1650-free, as well as earning honorable mention All-America accolades in the 200-free.

A native of Flint, Mich., Leix concluded her collegiate career as a 16-time All-American (11 first team – nine individual and two relays, plus five time honorable mention All-American – four individual and one relay). At the 2012 Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Championship Meet, she won her second straight GLIAC titles in the 500-free and the 1650-free. She broke the GLIAC record in the 500-free, a mark that stood for 21 years.

She had a perfect 4.00 G.P.A. in six semesters.

Augustana (S.D.) College, the University of Indianapolis and Wingate University each had a pair of selections on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large first team. Senior wrestlers **Marcus Edgington** and **Cody Lensing** represent Augustana on the first team while swimmers **Austin Biefnes** and **Guy Kogel** represent Indianapolis. Swimmer **Braden Jackson** and golfer **Marko Blazevski** are the Wingate products who made the first team.

A senior physics major with a 3.82 GPA, Edgington finished the season with a 22-4 record and three falls for the Vikings, who tied for tenth at the NCAA Division II national championship meet. A native of Sioux City, Iowa, Edgington was a two-time All-American, finishing fourth at 157 lbs. as a sophomore and seventh as a junior. His senior season ended prematurely due to injury. A three-time Academic All-Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference selection, he received an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship and will attend the University of Minnesota.

A biochemistry major with a 3.96 G.P.A., Lensing was the NCAA Elite 89 winner at the Division II national championship meet. The national runner-up at 125-pounds, he posted an 18-6 record with three falls. An All-American honoree as a senior, he was awarded with the prestigious Dr. William Britton Scholar-Athlete Award for Academic Excellence by the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in 2012. A second team all-conference selection, he also earned an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

Biefnes and Kogel led Indianapolis to a 12th place finish at the NCAA Division II championship meet.

A senior chemistry/pre-med major with a 3.99 G.P.A., Biefnes was a third team selection on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large last year. A native of Aurora, Col., he was an honorable mention All-American in the 400 I.M. and the 200-free relay. He won the consolation final in the 200-yard backstroke and the 400-yard IM at the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championship meet. He finished his career fourth all-time on the Greyhounds' all-time list in the 200-yard backstroke, 200-yard IM and 400-yard IM.

A native of Nahalal, Israel, Kogel is a graduate student who is working on his MBA. He graduated from Indianapolis with a degree in computer science and a 3.78 GPA. Honored as the Ulndy swimming Most Valuable Performer twice, he earned All-American honors at the 2012 NCAA Division II Swimming & Diving Championships with a seventh place showing in the 200-yard butterfly, 200-yard medley relay, and 400-yard medley relay. He was also an honorable mention All-American in the 100-yard butterfly and 400-yard free relay. He ended his career as the school record-holder in the 200-yard butterfly and part of the 200 and 400-yard medley relay teams.

A senior accounting major with a 3.93 G.P.A., Jackson led Wingate to the 2012 South Atlantic Conference championship and the Bulldogs' first trip to the NCAA Division II Championships. A four-year standout for the Bulldogs, the Dallas, N.C. native averaged 75.0 per round on the year. He finished second at the SAC Tournament with a 220 total. His top performance during the regular season was a tie for fifth at the Myrtle Beach Intercollegiate, shooting two-under par. A two-time SAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year award winner, he averaged 76.1 strokes per round for his career.

A Finance major with a 3.84 G.P.A., Blazevski is the lone sophomore on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large first team. A native of Skopje, Macedonia, he won his second straight national championship in the 400 I.M. A four-time All-American, he led Wingate to its fifth consecutive Bluegrass Mountain Conference championship. Blazevski earned All-American honors in the 400 I.M., the 500-free, the 1650-free, and the 800-free relay. He received the J. Howard Williams Award in 2012 for the Male Athlete of the Year at Wingate. In 2011, Blazevski was a three-time All-American.

Senior **John Nunns** of Mount Olive College is also a repeat selection on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large team. A business administration major with a 3.91 G.P.A., he earned second team honors last year. A standout for the Trojans' volleyball team, he led Mount Olive to a 17-14 record and a runner-up finish at the Conference Carolinas Tournament. A native of Fayetteville, N.C., he finished the season with a .307 hitting percentage while averaging 2.16 kills per set. The Most Valuable Player at the 2011 Conference Carolinas Tournament, he owns the school record for single season hitting percentage and was named second team all-conference as a senior.

The final wrestler on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large first team is **Jordan Larsen** from Colorado School of Mines. A senior civil engineering major with a 3.98 G.P.A., Larsen posted a 16-5 record as a senior at 165 lbs., including a perfect 7-0 mark in Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference duals. A two-time national qualifier, he received the NCAA Division II Wrestling Elite 88 Award in 2011. A native of Bayfield, Col., he was a three-time first team Academic All-RMAC pick and was also the 2011 RMAC Academic Wrestler of the Year.

The other three seniors on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large first team include **Matthew Killen** of Newberry College, **Erik Soderstrom** of the University of Alaska Fairbanks and **Daniel Stapff** of Barry University.

A business administration major with a minor in sports management and a 3.96 G.P.A., Killen was the top golfer for Newberry. As a senior, he had a 74.0 average. His top finish as a senior was a tie for sixth in the Magnolia Collegiate Invitational and he finished in the top 20 in six of his seven events. As a junior, he broke the school record by firing a 65 at the Rutgers Invitational. A native of Yorkshire, England, he led Newberry to the NCAA Division II quarter-finals as a junior.

A standout for the skiing team at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, Soderstrom is a senior geography major with a 3.92 G.P.A. A native of As, Sweden, he earned second team All-Central Collegiate Ski Association honors, helping the Nanooks to the 2012 CCSA title and a second place finish at the 2012 NCAA Central Region Championship. Named as UAF's Geography Student of the Year, he had six top ten finishes and reached the podium three times, including a first and a second. He won the U.S. Nationals Sprint Race as a sophomore.

A finance major with a 3.92 G.P.A., Stapff was a standout golfer at Barry University. A senior from Curitiba, Brazil, he finished fourth at the NCAA Division II Championships after carding a seven-under par in the 54-hole tournament. He was named as the NCAA Elite 89 award winner at NCAA Championship twice in the last three years. Stapff finished the year with a 72.39 average per round for 36 rounds, the best on the team. He owns the school record with four tournament wins and had five other top-five finishes. The owner of the school record for career stroke average at 72.92, he earned first team GCAA All-American honors and was the Sunshine State Conference Player of the Year. He was also the SSC Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year twice.

Juniors **Mark Rubin** of the University of the Incarnate Word, **Christopher White** of St. Cloud State University and **Ben Boesing** of the University of Southern Indiana round out the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large first team.

A biology major with a 3.97 G.P.A., Rubin is a three-time All-American swimmer who was the NCAA Division II runner-up in the 1,000-free. A native of Phoenix, Ariz., he set a school record with a 9:06.63 time and finished fifth in the 1650-free. He was also an honorable mention All-American in four events. Named as the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Male Academic Athlete of the Year, he was All-RMAC in three events. The owner of four school records, he was named as the 2012 RMAC Co-Swimmer of the Meet.

Named as the NCAA Division II Men's Diver of the Year, White is an economics major with a 3.40 G.P.A. White won both the one and three-meter diving events at the 2012 NCAA Division II Swimming & Diving Championships, setting a Division II record in the three-meter event with 581.65 points. A Rochester, Minn. native, he is a six-time All-American.

A junior tennis player at Southern Indiana, Boesing is a business administration major with a 3.90 G.P.A. An All-Great Lakes Valley Conference choice in 2012, he finished the season with a 27-5 singles record and a 21-10 mark in doubles play. A Floyds Knobs, Ind., native, he played most of the season at number three singles and number three doubles, helping USI post a 21-4 record. Southern Indiana won the GLVC East Division title and finished third in the GLVC Tournament.

The 15 members of the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Men's At-Large first team have an average G.P.A. of 3.89.

Leix is joined on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Women's At-Large first team by a pair of sisters, **Maura Donahue** and **Megan Donahue**, members of the swimming team at Indianapolis. Maura Donahue was a Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Women's At-Large second team selection last year while Megan Donahue earned third team notice.

Skier **Jaime Bronga** of Alaska Anchorage and two-sport standout **Colleen Harriger** of Gannon also moved up to the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Women's At-Large first team after earning second team notice last year.

A nursing major with a 3.75 G.P.A., Maura Donahue has been named as the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Swimmer of the Year the last two seasons. While leading Indianapolis to an 11th place finish at the NCAA championship meet, she earned seven All-America honors. In her career, the Milan, Mich. native has accumulated 17 first team All-America awards and four honorable mention notices. She led the Greyhounds to a third place finish at the GLIAC championship meet by winning the 100-free, the 200-free and two relays. A three-time national runner-up, she was the GLIAC Freshman of the Year in 2010.

The older sister of Maura, Meghan Donahue is a computer science major with a 3.84 G.P.A. A nine-time NCAA first team All-American in her career, she earned honorable mention All-America notice eight times. The winner of the 2011 Ulndy Chuck Mallendar Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year award, the Milan, Mich. native graduated as the owner of school records in the 100 and 200 backstroke. She is also a member of all five school record-setting relay teams.

A civil engineering major with a 3.99 G.P.A., Bronga is a four-time All-American skier at Alaska Anchorage. A native of Anchorage, Alaska., she was the Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association Nordic Most Valuable Performer for women in 2012. At the NCAA Division II championship meet, she led the Seawolves to a fifth place finish. As a senior, she was UAA's top skier 13 of 14 races with a career high four victories and 11 top-five finishes.

A two-sport performer who was a member of the water polo and the swimming teams at Gannon, Harriger is a senior pre-med and biology major with a 3.97 G.P.A. A native of Erie, Pa., she was a standout for the water polo team with 65 goals, 52 assists, 70 steals, 11 earned kickouts and 11 field saves. She broke the school assist record while scoring the fifth-most goals (65) in school history. She ranks second all-time at Gannon in assists (110), second in steals (187) and third in goals (208). She also swam the butterfly and I.M. events for Gannon's swimming team.

Swimmers were chosen to seven of the 15 spots on the Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Women's At-Large first team. Senior **Amanda Burden** of Southern Connecticut, senior **Kristen McCandless** of Shippensburg and junior **Julie Widmann** of Ashland complete the contingent of swimmers on the first team.

Named as the Northeast-10 Conference Diver of the Year at Southern Connecticut State University four times, Burden is a psychology major with a 3.76 G.P.A. A native of Orange, Conn., she is a four-time All-American and three-time winner of the Most Outstanding Performer award at the NE-10 Championship Meet. Burden won her third NE-10 three-meter diving title this year as she led the Owls to their ninth straight NE-10 title. She is a three-time NE-10 Scholar-Athlete Excellence Award winner and is a finalist for the 2012 NE-10 Woman of the Year Award.

An elementary education major with a 3.90 G.P.A., McCandless earned three honorable mention All-America awards at the 2012 NCAA Division II Swimming Championships for Shippensburg. The Macungie, Pa., native helped the Raiders win the 2012 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship. She finished third in the 200-free at the PSAC Meet and was part of Shippensburg's 800-free relay team that finished first.

One of three juniors on the Capital One Academic All-America® Women's At-Large Division II first team, Widmann is a marketing major with a 3.89 G.P.A. A native of Littleton, Col., she won the national championship in the 100-backstroke, setting a school record (0:54.66). A 20-time All-American in her career, she has also been part of two 200-yard freestyle relay teams that won national titles. She helped Ashland to a seventh place finish in 2012.

A trio of senior tennis players, **Gina Cielo** of Harding, **Julie Stas** of Barry and **Audrey Tompkins** of St. Edward's, were also named to the Capital One Academic All-America® Women's At-Large Division II first team.

A senior public relations major from Lees Summit, Mo., Cielo has a 3.95 G.P.A. She became only the tenth Harding University tennis player to record at least 50 career singles victories as she finished her career with 57 wins. As a senior, she led the Lady Bison with a 20-5 singles record and a 14-5 doubles mark. In her final two seasons, she won 19 consecutive singles matches.

A native of Brussels, Belgium, Stas helped Barry University to a 26-1 record and a number three national ranking. An international studies major with a 3.62 G.P.A., she led Barry to its third straight Sunshine State Conference title and a berth in the NCAA Division II semi-finals. Stas posted a 15-3 record as a singles player this year and finished her career with a 30-5 record. She posted a 58-15 doubles record in her career, including a 23-3 mark as a senior. In 2011, she helped Barry win the NCAA Division II Tournament championship.

A senior finance major with a 4.00 G.P.A. Tompkins led St. Edward's to the Heartland Conference tennis championship. A native of Katy, Texas, she was named as the co-winner of the Heartland Conference Outstanding Senior of the Year award. She also earned first team all-conference honors en route to leading the Hilltoppers to an NCAA Division II Regional Tournament appearance and a No. 36 national ranking.

A pair of lacrosse standouts, senior **Emily Mongeau** of Southern New Hampshire and junior **Alexandria Quast** of Tiffin, were also named to the Capital One Academic All-America® Women's At-Large Division II first team.

An elementary education major with a 3.84 G.P.A., Mongeau led Southern New Hampshire in virtually every statistical category for the second straight year. The Westborough, Mass., native scored 48 goals with 21 assists for 69 points. A four-time Northeast-10 all-conference selection, she finished her career as the program's all-time leader in goals, points, draw controls, and caused turnovers. The Northeast-10 Scholar-Athlete award winner for lacrosse, she earned IWLCA second team All-Region honors.

The NCAA Division II leader in goals scored, Quast is a sport and recreation management major with a 3.96 G.P.A. at Tiffin. The Lockport, N.Y., native finished the season as the national leader in goals scored (82) and goals per game average (4.82). She was named as the Division II Independent Women's Lacrosse Player of the Year. In 2011, she scored 84 goals with 97 points.

Seniors **Deborah Amos** of Charleston and **Maria Besio** of Newberry (S.C.) round out the Capital One Academic All-America® Women's At-Large Division II first team.

A biology and pre-pharmacy major with a 4.00 G.P.A., Amos led Charleston's varsity-four boat to a top ranking in the NCAA Division II East Region. A native of Parkersburg, W.Va., she was also a first team District 2 All-Academic selection in cross country and track & field this year. She finished third in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference cross country championship meet and she also earned All-Atlantic Region honors in cross country.

A senior golfer, Besio has a 3.95 G.P.A. as a business administration major at Newberry. A native of Buenos Aires, Argentina, Besio became Newberry's first-ever All-America first team selection in women's golf. She also earned NGCA second team All-America honors in 2009. The 2012 and 2009 South Atlantic Conference Golfer of the Year, she won the SAC title in 2012 and 2010 and was the NCAA Division II national runner-up in 2010.

There are seven swimmers, three tennis players, two lacrosse players, a skier, a golfer, a rower and a water polo player on the Capital One Academic All-America® NCAA Division II Women's At-large first team. The 15 members of the first team have an average G.P.A. of 3.89.
