# TROY GROSENICK - HOBEY BAKER AWARD FINALIST/ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE

As a freshman last season, Troy Grosenick had the opportunity to travel with the Dutchmen to most of their road contests.

Although Grosenick did not see action on the ice on the road behind first team All-American Keith Kinkaid and senior Corey Milan, the young goaltender got a taste of each of ECAC Hockey's arenas, filing each experience into the memory bank for the future.

Entering the 2011-12 season, with Milan gone to graduation and Kinkaid to a pro contract with the New Jersey Devils, the future is now, as Grosenick, a sophomore, now finds himself the veteran of Union's goaltending corps.

In addition to Grosenick, Union's goalie trio includes Colin Stevens, a freshman out of Niskayuna, and freshman Dillon Pieri.

"Obviously it was a great experience to be along for the ride, in your freshman year to see all the ECAC schools to know what to expect your sophomore year," Grosenick said. "To get to the national tournament was huge. It was a great experience for everyone that was there to know what it takes to get back to that level, and what it takes to compete in one of those games."

Grosenick is no stranger to big games. The Brookfield, Wisconsin native was a highly touted goaltender coming out of junior hockey, a USHL All-Star for the Cedar Rapid Rough Riders in 2009-10.

Last season, he acquitted himself well at the collegiate level in limited action, with a goals-against average of 2.12 and 0-0-1 record in three contests.

This season, it didn't take long for Grosenick to acclimate himself not only as the No. 1 goaltender for Union, but as one of the top goaltenders in the nation. And yet, the competition remains among Union's three goaltenders, who have established a close friendship over the course of the season.

"As a group we get along great," Grosenick said. "That's something that happened last year. Corey (Milan), Keith (Kinkaid) and I got along great. This year, we're just trying to push each other in practice. Whoever has the best week in practice is going to end up in the net, and they'll have the support of the other two guys. We've developed a mutual respect for each other."

As for Grosenick, the experience of 2010-11 was invaluable, not only to experience hostile environments on the road, but to learn from two talented goaltenders in Milan and Kinkaid.

In addition, the sophomore draws some of his own leadership qualities from a pro sports hero in his native Wisconsin.

"Wisconsin sports have been on a bit of a hot streak here," Grosenick said. "I'm not sure how much that correlates to our team. But Aaron Rodgers is a role model of mine, and I just try to model his demeanor, and its something I try to take after. I think it helps to emulate people that have had a lot of success."

Sophomore goaltender Troy Grosenick, who entered the season with just one career start, is in the midst of a record setting season in net for the Dutchmen in 2011-12. Grosenick, who has started 30 of 38 games, is second in the nation in winning percentage (.768) third in goals-against average (1.65), third in save percentage (.936), and is tied for third in shutouts (5), matching Kris Mayotte '06 for the school single-season record with his fifth shutout of the season against Princeton on Feb. 17....Has allowed two goals or less in 24 of 30 starts this season...A five-time ECAC Hockey Goaltender of the Week winner (Oct. 24, Nov. 8, Jan. 16, Jan. 31, and Mar. 19)...Earned ECAC Hockey Goaltender of the Month honors in January...Earned his first career win with 17 saves in the team's first game and win against Army on 10/08/11...Recorded 32 saves in a 2-2 tie against Western Michigan on 10/14/11...Made 23 saves in a 3-3 tie against Western Michigan on 10/15/11...Stopped 23 shots for his first shutout in a 5-0 win against RIT on 10/22/11...Made 21 saves in a 2-1 OT loss against UNH on 10/28/11...Stopped one shot against American International on 10/29/11 before leaving due to a stomach bug...Made 27 saves in a 2-0 win against St. Lawrence on 11/4/11...Stopped 22 shots in a 3-1 victory against Clarkson on 11/5/11...Made 14 saves against Yale on 11/12/11...Recorded 21 saves in a 5-1 win against RPI on 11/15/11...Stopped 33 shots in a 6-3 win at Michigan on 11/27/11...Made 23 saves in a 5-2 win against RPI on 12/10/11...Stopped 19 shots in a 3-1 win against Merrimack on 12/17/11...Made 23 saves against Denver on 12/30/11...Recorded 22 saves on 12/31/11 against Colorado College...Made 23 saves against Harvard on 1/6/12...Recorded 29 saves in a 7-1 win over Dartmouth on 1/7/12...Recorded 18 saves in a 2-0 shutout win over Harvard on 1/13/12...Registered 39 saves, his highest count, in a 5-1 win against RPI on 1/14/12...Turned away 29 shots in a 3-1 win victory at Yale on 1/20/12...Stopped 20 shots against Brown on 1/21/12...Recorded 30 saves against Clarkson for a 5-2 win on 1/27/12...Made 26 saves in a 6-0 shutout win against St. Lawrence on 1/28/12...Recorded 18 stops for a 3-0 shutout win against Princeton on 2/17/12...Stopped 16 shots against Quinnipiac on 2/18/12...Registered 17 saves against Cornell on 2/24/12...Stopped 25 shots against Colgate for a 5-2 win on 2/25/12...Stopped 21 of 23 shots in his first playoff win, a 3-2 victory over Rensselaer...Closed out the ECAC Quarterfinal series against RPI with a 28 save performance in a 4-2 win...Stopped 28 shots in a 6-2 win over Colgate in the ECAC Semifinals...Recorded 16 saves in a 3-1 win over Harvard in the ECAC Championship Game.
